Library (Gavin Claypool): The vintage paperback show yielded the club \$781.

Quartermaster (Susan Fox): Gearing up for having a job, determining location of beverage vending machine, and other quartermaster needs.

Archives (Cathy Johnson): Nothing new to report, but hoping to move archives to somewhere accessible.

Physical Plant/Storage (Rob Powell): No report, looking forward to moving out of storage!

AV Equipment (Dean Johnson): No report, but the equipment is in storage and planning to move.

Events (Eylat Poliner): LASFS programs are in progress. The Czech Consulate event moved to June 27, and our host will wine and dine us. It’s not a hybrid meeting this time because there are no mobile phones nor cameras allowed in the consulate. A new Consul is coming in soon, but they will keep in touch with our club.

Loscon 50 (Eylat Poliner): The guests have notified the hotel liaison for hotel rooms. There are some issues with the guest of honor. 350+ memberships have been sold so far. A Chairman’s Message and Progress Report have gone out. Kristine Cherry is doing an amazing job on the Web site. Loscon 50 is very much on track.

Loscon 51 has sent out guest of honor letters.

Webmistress (Kristine Cherry): Minutes and *De Prof* are up to date, and accessed through the top of the Web page. Everything has been renewed: Domain, SSO certificate, etc. Would like to discuss with Elayne Pelz.

Eylat Poliner and Michelle Pincus, the previous two con chairs, would like to keep some consistency with the Loscon Web site rather than “reinventing the wheel” every year. Do what Gallifrey One does, change the committee as needed, but keep the repeating event information. Change the theme and

guests of honor, but not have to do the same work over every year.

Elayne Pelz has no objection to this scheme; it's a good one.

Matthew B. Tepper asked about provisions for archiving the old Web site.

Eylat Poliner indicated we're backing up on Carbonite.

Tepper wants to keep Howard Waldrop's writing on our Web site, and other previous guests of honor statements of thanks.

Kristine Cherry: Carbonite is not really an effective solution. She will screenshot through the *Wayback Machine* and add to a dedicated Web page. Not all previous con Web pages will be very easy to archive due to crashes, but she will work on it.

Cathy Johnson agreed that an archive/history page is needed.

Pelz will not guarantee that we have archives of all the old Loscon Web pages, and not all links will be good.

Heide Nichols suggested printouts of PDFs.

Cherry: PDFs take too much storage room.

Poliner moves to keep the current Loscon Web site archived. Moved, seconded, and passed.

Cherry deserves a round of applause.

Pelz will show anyone how to locate old Loscon pages. Don't bother Cherry with this, contact Pelz.

Dean Johnson wants to not lock us into Web page details too specifically, wants flexibility.

Supplement

The new, revised proposed By-Laws change as passed by Elayne Pelz, Susan Fox, Heide Nichols, and Matthew B. Tepper is now submitted to the board at large for consideration, including possible amendment.

The purpose of the proposed change is to recognize that technology has advanced, and to allow that directors can participate in board meetings via telepresence.

As it reads currently:

Article III: Directors.

Section 1. Number and Qualifications.

A. The authorized number of Directors, as stated in the Articles of Incorporation, is eleven.

B. Each Director must be 18 years of age or older at the time of their election.

C. When elected, and continuously while serving, each Director shall meet the following qualifications:

1. Be an Attending Member, and have maintained such Attending Membership for at least 156 regular Society meetings;

2. Be an Attending Member continuously during the previous 52 regular Society meetings, unless prevented from doing so by a medical condition or by being temporarily absent from the area;

3. Reside within Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County;

It is proposed to revise the By-Laws as follows:

Revise III.1.C.3. to read:

3. Reside in the states of California, Nevada, Arizona, or Oregon.

Insert III.1.D. and III.1.E. as follows:

D. At no time shall there be more than three Directors residing outside of Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County.

E. In the event that three Directors already reside outside of the counties specified in III.1.C.3., and another Director changes residence to one outside of the counties specified in III.1.C.3., that Director shall be required to vacate their office as a Director. ("In the event that" instead of "Should an occasion arise" and "vacate" instead of "forfeit")

Renumber all following paragraphs appropriately.

Fannish Wellness Committee: No updates

Timebound announcements: There will be a book festival at the Wende Museum in Culver City to be held on June 29, and LASFS will have a table there. The museum owns more than 100,000 artifacts related to the Cold War period, and its name is a colloquial German term for "turning point."
