

# Van Vogt's Grand Slan Robert Jennings





The September 1940 issue of *Astounding Science Fiction* featured the first installment of A.E. Van Vogt's groundbreaking novel *Slan*. It wasn't the first story about telepaths, or even the first novel length tale exploring the problems and hazards of telepaths in a non-telepath society, but *Slan* was by far the most significant, and certainly the most popular stf story of telepathy ever written. Its publication changed the entire premise of esp powers and human society in the science fiction genre forever.

*Slan*'s author A.E. Van Vogt was born in April of 1912 as Alfred Vogt in Edenburg, Manitoba, Canada, the third of six children to a family living in a small Russian Mennonite community. His family moved frequently while he was a child, leading to an unhappy childhood.

He was working as a clerk in the Canadian Census Bureau when he decided to take the Palmer Institute correspondence course in writing. In 1932, the heart of the Depression, he sold his first piece of fiction to a true confession magazine. He continued to write true confession tales, almost always published anonymously, thru the late 1930s. He moved to Winnipeg and branched out to doing interviews for trade magazines and writing short radio scripts for station CKY. At some point he added "Elton" to his name, then around 1937 also added "van" after which he was known as A. E. van Vogt.

He decided to write science fiction because he enjoyed reading it. Impressed by an issue of *Astounding* he bought off the newsstands, he decided to send his work to that magazine first. His initial story was rejected by editor John Campbell, but Campbell wrote a note suggesting that Van Vogt try again.

He did. His second story was "The Black Destroyer", the story of a ferocious alien intelligence that stalks a human star ship, was an impressive tour-de-force that netted him the cover of the July 1939 issue of *Astounding* and wide-spread acclaim from the science fiction community.

This particular story was the inspiration for a great many science fiction tales that followed, including being adapted to a memorable *Star Trek* episode, and swiped for the movie *Alien* (Van Vogt sued 20<sup>th</sup> Century Fox for plagiarism and won \$50,000 in an out of court settlement in 1980)

Four other short stories appeared before he finished his first novel, *Slan*, in 1940. Campbell was suitably impressed with the novel, but for some reason did not give it a cover illo. Instead, the September 1940 issue features a fairly hum-drum pic of a spaceship observing a planetary conjunction with a red star.

In an odd move Campbell then decided to devote the cover of the October issue to *Slan*. The October issue carried the second installment of the serial.

Slan deals with a race of telepaths, allegedly created by Samuel Lann. Slans have highly enhanced strength, speed, and stamina, along with the ability to evoke speedy recovery from any injury by entering a temporary trance-like state. They also have telepathic powers. Golden Slans have two small golden tendrils on their forehead. They can read the minds of anyone and can communicate with other Slans via telepathy. The second

type of Slan does not have the golden knobs or the ability to read minds, but they can hide their thoughts from the golden Slans.

In this future, dictator Kier Gray is leading a campaign to exterminate all Slans as threats to human civilization, and he is succeeding in his goal remarkably well. The Golden Slans have been hunted almost to extinction, and his security forces are rapidly rooting out the non-telepathic Slan population as well.

The story deals with nine-year-old Johnny Cross, a Golden Slan, who travels with his mother to Earth's capital



city on a secret mission. They are discovered, Johnny's mother is killed, and Johnny is on the run, the heir to his father's unique inventions, plus he may also represent a hidden hope for the survival of the Slan population, if he can live long enuf to figure out what is happening and why. The forces of the dictatorship are relentless, and the human population is generally not sympathetic. The adventure is a harrowing suspense thriller where more information about Johnny, his family, the true origins of the Slan population, and dark secrets of the dictator Kier Gray are revealed in a series of dangerous and nearly lethal encounters.

The effect of *Slan* on the science fiction community was immediate and long lasting. Van Vogt's writing style was essentially polished pulp magazine style adventure, with sequences of eight hundred to a thousand words or so in which something has to take place, leading to a crisis point of some type which has to either be resolved, or intensified in the next segment. Some literary critics find this particular style of writing to be unprofessional and also prone to creating plot situations that may not necessarily be properly resolved, but readers and magazine editors loved it. Van Vogt was one of the most popular science fiction writers of the Golden Age of science fiction, and his name on the cover of any magazine issue guaranteed a solid bump in sales.

In 1946 Arkham House Books, the noted small press publisher of the works of H.P. Lovecraft and other supernatural and horror authors, decided to publish *Slan* as one of their offerings. Sales of Arkham House books were generally modest, but publisher August Derleth opted for a 4,000

copy print run, and found that *Slan* was the fastest selling title in his entire catalog.

The story was reprinted numerous times thereafter. In 1951 a slightly revised edition was published in hardback by Simon & Schuster. *Fantastic Story Magazine* reprinted the novel complete in their Summer 1952 issue. It next appeared was a Dell Mapback paperback in 1953. That edition sold thru and a new edition with a slightly different cover was issued by Dell in late 1953.

Meanwhile it was translated into several foreign languages, including Japanese, and published overseas in both magazine and paperback editions. In 1959 Van Vogt made a deal with the science fiction book club to start issuing his material thru their platform. Triad was a thick book that presented *The World of Null-A*, *The Voyage of the Space Beagle* (a linkage of several of his short stories, including The Black Destroyer), and *Slan*. The retail price for this volume was \$1.90, but it stayed in print for many years because it was one of their favorite introductory membership titles ("Get 6 different science fiction books for only \$1.00 when you join").

Ballentine Books put out a brand new paperback edition in 1961. That same year Panther Books issued it in the UK, with sales to all the Commonwealth nations. Berkley printed a paperback edition in 1968 that stayed in print thru multiple reprints for the next twenty years. There were other hardback editions, special illustrated editions, and in fact, from 1968 right thru to the present time *Slan* has never been out of print, a remarkable printing history for a remarkable novel, a story that is just as rewarding on rereading as it was when you originally encountered it. From its original appearance in 1940 to now, *Slan* remains a cornerstone in the literature of science fiction.



Bob Jennings has been involved in fandom since the late 1950s, and is one of the original founding members of comics fandom, founding the SFPA and publishing hundreds of fanzines. From 1979 to 2000, Bob ran a science fiction/comics/game store, which is now all mail order. He's currently at work to develop a device that will zap robo-callers and internet spammers.

# Baen Announces Fantasy Award Finalists Jason P Hunt

Baen Books recently announced the finalists for the 2024 Baen Fantasy Adventure Award.

Launched in 2014, the award celebrates original fantasy short stories focused on heroics, high stakes, and adventure. Whether it's sword and sorcery or urban fantasy or something that includes dragons, the award covers all subgenres in the fantasy category. "One of the great things about this contest is the breadth of subgenres we get to see, and this year has been no exception," said Baen publisher Toni Weisskopf.

Alameda, Courtney. War of the Scaleborn [World of Warcraft: Dragonflight]. Worlds, 24.95 tp.

As Alexstrasza and her flights set to reshaping Azeroth, not all of dragonkind sees Order magic as a gift. Spurning the titans' interference, a group of rebel primal dragons are imbued with the elemental powers of the planet and are reborn as the Incarnates. Led by Iridikron, the Incarnates believe that dragonkind should be subservient to no one and foment a rebellion against the Aspects: what they are and all they represent.

• Ashby, Madeline. Glass Houses. Tor, 23.99 tp.

A group of employees and their CEO, celebrating the sale of their remarkable emotion-mapping AI algorithm, crash onto a not quite deserted tropical island. Luckily, those who survived have found a beautiful, fully-stocked private palace, with all the latest technological updates (though one without connection to the outside world). The house, however, has more secrets than anyone might have guessed, and a much darker reason for having been built and left behind.

• Ashing-Giwa, Kemi. *The Splinter in the Sky*. Saga, 25.99 tp.

All the lowly scribe Emitan wants is to quit her day job and expand her fledgling tea business. But when her lover is assassinated and her sibling is abducted by Imperial soldiers, Enitan abandons her idyllic plans and weaves her tea tray up through the heart of the Vaalbaran capital. There, she will learn just how far she is willing to go to exact vengeance, free her sibling, and perhaps even secure her homeland's freedom.

• Barnes, Steven. Mace Windu: The Glass Abyss [Star Wars]. Worlds, 39.99 hc.

The Jedi are reeling from Qui-Gon Jinn's sudden death at the hands of a Sith. Jedi Master Mace Windu is surprised to receive a final message from Qui-Gon, marked to be delivered to Mace in the event of Qui-Gon's death. The message contains a last request: a plea to help the Outer Rim planet Metagos. As a young Jedi, Qui-Gon protected the Sa'ad farming clan from the planet's less-scrupulous factions. And now the Sa'ad's leader has begged for the Jedi's help in freeing Metagos from the crime lords who threaten to eradicate her people's way of life.

• Blake, Olivie. *Masters of Death*. Tor, 24.99 tp.

Vampire real estate agent Viola Marek is trying to sell a haunted house. The ghost haunting the house has been murdered, and until he can solve the mystery of how he died, he refuses to move on. She will need the help of the fraudulent medium Fox D'Mora.

• Brennan, Sarah Rees. Long Live Evil [Time of Iron #1]. Orbit, 25.99 tp.

When her whole life collapsed, Rae still had books. Dying, she seizes a second chance at living: a magical bargain that lets her enter the world of her favorite fantasy series. She wakes in a castle on the edge of a hellish chasm, in a kingdom on the brink of war. Home to dangerous monsters, scheming courtiers and her favourite fictional character, the Once and Forever Emperor. But, in this fantasy world, she discovers she's not the heroine, but the villainess in the Emperor's tale.

• Brooks, Terry. Sister of Starlit Seas [Viridian Deep #3]. Del Rey, 24.95 tp.

Auris's adoptive sister Char knows she will never grow into the woman she was meant to be under her family's loving but repressive eye, so a month before she turns fifteen, she runs away and joins a Human pirate crew in the warm southerly regions of her world. Then, three years into her pirate career, her captain - the man she is convinced she loves - is captured by the leaders of the slave trade he has been fighting.

• Buchanan, Lynn. The Dollmakers. Voyager, 24.99 tp.

In the country called One, an artisan's doll is the height of society's accomplishments, while a guard's doll is the only thing standing between the people of One and the Shod: vicious, cobbled monstrosities that will tear apart any structure - living or dead, inanimate or otherwise - to add to their horde. Dollmaker Apprentice Shean of Pearl intends to outsmart and destroy the Shod, once and for all, but when the time comes for her dolls to be licensed, she's told her work is too beautiful and delicate to fight.

• Butler, D. J. Between Princesses and Other Jobs [Indrajit & Fix #2]. Baen, 12.99 pb.

Indrajit and Fix are the founding partners of the Protagonists, a jobber company in Kish. Since the seven great families of Kish farm out all tasks they and the city need doing, a jobber might one day unblock a well, the next day man a tollgate for the fair, and on the third hunt down a murderer on the loose, all in a corrupt old city that isn't so much governed as kept barely in bounds. Meanwhile, the criminals they investigate, rival jobbers, sorcerers, spies, assassins, and other mysterious parties have more and more reason to want the Protagonists dead. Welcome to Kish.

• Callaghan, Jo. *In the Blink of an Eye*. Random House, 24.95 tp.

Cop Kat Frank is picked to lead a pilot program that has her paired with Lock, an AIDE (Artificially Intelligent Detective Entity) - a hologram that is activated by a device on Kat's wrist. She finds her gut reactions often conflict with Lock's statistical calculations and data analysis. But Lock is the only one who can help when a case begins to target Kat personally.

• Connolly, John. The Land of Lost Things [The Book of Lost Things #2]. Atria, 25.99 tp.

8 year old Phoebe lies comatose following a car accident. Ceres, her mother, sits by her bedside reading aloud Phoebe's favourite fairy stories in the hope they might summon her back to this world. But an old house on the hospital grounds, a property connected to a book written by a vanished author, is calling to Ceres. Something wants her to enter, to journey to the Land of Lost Things.

• Corey, James S. A. The Mercy of the Gods [The Captive's War]. Little Brown, 39.00 hc.

The Carryx - part empire, part hive - have waged wars of conquest for centuries, destroying or enslaving species across the galaxy. Now, they are facing a great and deathless enemy. The key to their survival may rest with the humans of Anjiin. Caught up in academic intrigue and affairs of the heart, Dafyd Alkhor is pleased just to be an assistant to a brilliant scientist and his celebrated research team. Then the Carryx ships descend, decimating the human population and taking the best and brightest of Anjiin society away to serve on the Carryx homeworld, and Dafyd is swept along with them.

• Davis, Hank (ed). *Tomorrow's Troopers*. Baen, 25.00 tp.

Tales from the Golden Age through the current era featuring military, police, and civilians utilizing powered armor. Stories by Joe Haldeman, Christopher Ruocchio, Jason Cordova, and more!

• De Bodard, Aliette. *Navigational Entanglements*. Tor.com, 27.99 tp.

When a Tangler escapes the Hollows for the first time in living memory, each navigator clan must send a representative to help capture it - but the mission may be doomed and the hearts of two clan juniors may be in danger too. 176 pages.

• Deneen, Brendan. Alien: Uncivil War. Titan, 23.99 tp.

After leaving a ruined Earth, it seems Chris and his daughters have crash-landed on a planet on the verge of all-out civil war. Chris will have to call on the battle skills he never wanted to use again in order to protect his daughters, deal with violence-hungry marines, and battle the xenomorph that's killing people regardless of which side of the civil war they're on.

• Enright, K. M. *Mistress of Lies* [*The Age of Blood #1*]. Orbit, 25.99 tp.

Shan LeClaire has spent her entire life perfecting her blood magic, building her network of spies, and gathering every scrap of power she could. Now, to protect her brother, she assassinates their father and takes her place at the head of the family. She must work with Samuel Hutchinson after he stumbles upon the first victim of a magical serial killer and is pulled deeply into the ravenous and bloodthirsty court of the vampire king.

• Feist, Raymond E. A Darkness Returns [Dragonwar Saga #1]. Voyager, 39.50 hc.

An epic new series that will join the Firemane Saga with the Riftwar Cycle. Hatushaly, last scion of the Firemane dynasty, his beloved Hava, and their dubious friend Donte have been transported across space and time from their war-torn world of Garn to the relative peace of Midkemia. There, on Sorcerer's Isle, under the guidance of the great magician Magnus and his reincarnated father Pug, Hatu will explore and expand his unique magical abilities. For if Garn is to be saved, they will be needed.

• Flint, Eric. 1638: The Sovereign States [Ring of Fire #36]. Baen, 12.99 pb.

Then the FBI asks for their help tracking down two mysterious serial killers. One who seems to be able to control electricity, and another who disappears from the scene of the crime in what witnesses describe as a puff of smoke.


