President's Annual Report

How have we done over the past year? A fair answer is that the N3F, like the tides, is sometimes at flood and sometimes at ebb. The past year has had some bright sides and some other sides.

On the bright side, Mindy and Jason Hunt have done a wonderful piece of work in energizing the FanAc-

tivity Gazette. It's a beautiful piece of fannish prose. Let us be grateful to all its contributors. Jean-Paul Garnier brought out an issue of Eldritch Science, our fiction zine, filled with tales of high quality.

Jefferson Swycaffer continues to edit N'APA, which is getting longer and longer. Indeed, it is about to hit the file size limit imposed by the internet service providers of some of our members. We have already had a bounce from one member for excessive length.

The National Fantasy Fan, Tightbeam, and the N3F Review of Books Incorporating Prose Bono have all been published on their monthly schedules, albeit with an occasional hiccup due to competing time demands at my end.

Less visible, but much larger, Jeffrey Redmond operates the Science Fiction Facebook Group. Under his leadership, it has grown from 8000 members to nearly 80,000 members. We use it to do outreach to fen.

There are new projects. We have historically had difficulties with the Franking Service trying to email zines to people. Various anti-spam shields have become more and more noxious. A solution was found. We have a new N3F zine, Frankinzine. It appears on our web pages, N3F.org, as a downloadable zip file. Within the file are a collection of fanzines all published over the last month. Downloadable means that file size and frequency of mailing disappear as issues.


Jacqueline Lichtenberg's suggestion that we should use N'APA to encourage fan fiction writers to appear and get friendly support and advice has been put into place. Indeed, we have at least one person taking advantage of the offer. Hopefully there will be many more.

Our Treasurer, Kevin Trainer, ran a science fiction convention, Son of SilverCon, which drew interested fen for fannish activities.

On the dimmer side, John Thiel withdrew as Editor of Ionisphere and as Editor of Origin. Ionisphere and Origin therefore went into hiatus. They could use new editors. There seemed to be appreciable interest in the author and fan interviews that Ionisphere published, but we need someone to do the interviews.

How do we make interviews work? As a thought, take a look at upstreamreviews.substack.com. They do large numbers of book reviews by multiple reviewers. The reviews are consistently good because they have a formula. Each review answers, in the same order, the same set of questions.

On a different dimmer side, dues-paying membership has declined. A year ago we had 39 duespaying members; we now have 33. We have regularly had 30 or more submissions to the short story contest; this year there have been none.

Now and then, it has been suggested to open the N3F Amateur Short Story Contest to professional writers, writers who have had one or two sales. I've never favored this. It is my opinion that we want new blood. We want to reward the new kids on the block. To be blunt, we want writing that is not that good. We want stories from people who don't know their object from their subject, who don't know where commas go, and who use apostrophes to denote plurals -- but who have a story to tell. I want stories from guys nobody's ever heard of...but in the years ahead, we will. Those who are already successful don't need the encouragement of our little contest. If they were to enter the contest, the danger is that they'd win, every time, and crowd out the promising newcomer.

1. This contest is open to all amateur writers in the field, regardless of whether they're members of the National Fantasy Fan Federation. For the purposes of this contest, we define an amateur as someone who has sold no more than two (2) stories to professional science fiction or fantasy publications.

2. Stories entered in the contest must be original, unpublished, not longer than 8,500 words in length—and related to the science fiction, fantasy, or similar genres in the opinion of the judge.

3. Email attachments of Word documents are acceptable for submission. Manuscripts on paper should be typed, single sided on 8 1/2"-by- 11" white paper, double spaced, with pages numbered. The name of the author should not appear anywhere on the manuscript to ensure impartial judging. Photocopies are acceptable, if they are of good quality. Computer printouts must be legible.

4. Contestants can enter up to three stories. Enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope (SASE) if you would like your story returned at the end of the contest. Stories will not be returned without an SASE. Do not send your only copy in case of accidental loss. We are not responsible for lost manuscripts.

5. Email entries will be accepted. Send to Jefferson P. Swycaffer at abontides@gmail.com. No guarantee can be made of email receipt. Privacy and property rights will be absolutely respected. No one other than the Short Story Judge will ever see the submission.

6. There are no entry fees.

7. Cash prizes totaling \$100 will be awarded as follows: First prize is \$50, second \$30, and third \$20. Honorable mentions and semi-finalists will receive a certificate of award.

8. Send all manuscripts to the contest manager: Jefferson Swycaffer, P. O. Box 15373, San Diego, CA 92175-5373; abontides@ gmail.com. Emails with the story attached in word format are preferred. Paper manuscripts are acceptable. All entries must be received or postmarked no later than Dec. 31, 2024.

9. The Short Story Judge is a published science fiction professional, and also a loving fan of the sf and fantasy genres. All comments and critiques are solely the Short Story Judge's opinion, but he promises to be constructive and polite.

10. Stories will also be reviewed by the Editor of the N3F Fiction zine Eldritch Science; authors of suitable tales will be invited to submit their tales for publication in our zine. This review and invitation will only occur after contest winners have been announced, so it can have no effect on the contest outcome.

11. The NSF may want to publish an electronic book including top entries from one or more years of publication. You will not be contacted about this until after the contest is over and prizes have been awarded. If we want to publish your story, you will have to sign over to us first world serial rights. Your willingness to sign over rights cannot affect whether or not you win the contest. Winners will be notified as soon as the judging is completed. Announcements and notifications of winning entries will be made by March 2025. Please take your time and submit your best work. You can resubmit stories previously entered if they did not win previously. All entries will be kept confidential and will be judged fairly and anonymously. The deadline for all entries is Dec. 31, 2024. Good luck!

Elections Bylaws

1) A dues-paying member becomes a candidate for President or for the Directorate by self-nominating or by being nominated by another dues-paying member. The nominee must accept the nomination to be placed on the ballot. Self-nominations are acceptances.

2) Nominations are made by sending the nomination to the Official Teller and to the Editor of The National Fantasy Fan. Nominations must be received by the Official Teller and the Editor by October 31.

3) Each candidate may place a statement of up to 500 words in The National Fantasy Fan. Statements shall appear in the November National Fantasy Fan, or an earlier issue if submitted in a timely way and the candidate so requests.

4) The election ballot shall appear in the November issue of the National Fantasy Fan. The ballot shall include a list of the candidates for each office and a space for write-in votes. Each dues-paying member may vote for one candidate for President and up to five candidates for the Directorate. Each ballot shall include a space in which the voter must sign and date the ballot.

5) Votes may be cast by sending the ballot or a facsimile to the official teller, or by sending the official teller an email ballot. The email ballot must come from the electronic address of record of the voter. Ballots for Constitutional amendments and member referenda are cast using the same process.

6) In addition to the regular candidates listed on the ballot, voters may write in the name of any dues-paying member as a vote for any elective office. Any candidate so elected must submit a written statement of his will-ingness to serve. In the absence of this statement, the candidate receiving the next highest number of votes for that office will be declared the winner.

7) The Official Teller is a dues-paying member appointed by the President. The appointment must be approved by Directorate vote before the Official Teller takes office. The Official Teller serves until he resigns or until the Directorate approves a new Official Teller.

8) Before taking office, a candidate must have paid dues to cover the year of his or her term of office.
